Owl Needle Keeper - by Darcy Ashton



Materials

- (6) 6" x 8" Pieces of Fusible Warm Fleece 2® (Double Sided) by the Warm CompanyTM
- (2) 6" x 8" Pieces of Fusible Warm Fleece 1® (Single Sided) by the Warm CompanyTM
- Lite Steam-a-Seam 2[®] Paper Backed Fusible Web by the Warm CompanyTM
- (8) 6" x 8" Pieces of Cotton Fabric
- Small Scraps of Cotton Fabric for the Owl Details
- (2) Small Fusible Crystals for the Eye Highlights
- (4) Metal Grommets
- (1) Metal "Book Binder" Type Keyring.

Make the Blank Pages

Use (6) 6" x 8" pieces of double sided Fusible Warm Fleece 2® and (6) pieces of fabric. Press them into pairs with the fabric on either side. You will now

have (3) fused fleece sandwich pages.


• Trace the "base piece" of the owl pattern (from

page 2) onto a piece of paper and cut it out with paper scissors.

• Pin the paper pattern to a fleece sandwich and sew around the

shape on your sewing machine with a straight stitch. Do not sew on the paper, simply use it as a guide.

- Remove the pins and paper pattern. Repeat these steps for the remaining fleece sandwiches until you have all three sewn.
- Use a ruler to mark horizontal lines on your base pieces starting 1/2" from the bottom edge.
- Sew on the lines all the way across the sandwiched rectangle.
- Trim the excess fabric away with scissors. Leave about 1/16" edge around the outside of the stitching line. This will
 - give you (3) two-sided blank pages. You may want to use pinking shears to add a decorative edge.
- Grommets will be added to the top center of each page at the end, and clipped with a keyring, to hold your needlebook together.



Make the Front Page

• Pin the paper owl shape to the front of a piece of 6" x 8" cotton fabric. Trace around the outside edge of the paper to mark the owl shape.

• Fuse this piece of fabric to a 6" x 8" piece of Warm Fleece 1[®] (Single Sided) by the Warm CompanyTM.

• Prepare the rest of the small applique fabric pieces with Steam-a-Seam® on the back of each piece.


• Fuse each applique piece in position using the pattern and the drawn line traced onto the cotton rectangle for positioning.

• Sew around each applique piece with a decorative stitch on your sewing machine.

• Fuse the last rectangle of Warm Fleece 1® to the last 6" x 8" piece of fabric.


• Sew 1/2" rows of stitching on this last piece to match the blank pages.

• Pin these two halves, fleece sides together, and sew on your drawn line for the owl shape. Trim as before -leaving 1/16" edge around the stitched line.



Add a metal grommet to the top of each page. Packages of metal grommets come with a tool and instructions.

• Attach all of the pages together with a "book binder" type metal key ring so that you can clip your needlebook anywhere that's handy for sewing.


